## What is Yomi?

- A single Kanji character has several pronunciations in Japanese.
- Yomi indicates pronunciation information expressed in syllabic / phonetic characters (Hiragana, Katakana or Roman Alphabet).
- In the case of NDLSH, pronunciation information is expressed in Katakana.
- e.g. Kanji character "東"(means east) has two pronunciations "higashi" and "azuma". Each of the pronunciation is expressed in three types of syllabic characters.
