Steps

- (FPWD) First Public Working Draft
- (WD) Working Draft
- (LCWD) Last Call Working Draft
- (CR) Candidate Recommendation
- (PR) Proposed Recommendation
- (Rec) Recommendation

Consensus

- Working Drafts
 - Do not represent consensus
- (Candidate/Proposed) Recommendations
 - Do represent consensus, but not done until end

First Public Working Draft

• First notification to chairs of other working groups

• Includes call for IP exclusions

Working Draft

- Publish early and often
- Continue publishing until "technically complete"
- No minimum review time between drafts

Last Call Working Draft

- Specially-marked working draft
- Group believes document is technically complete
- Notification to other group chairs again
- Minimum 3 week review period
- In practice, often the first time other groups comment . . .
- All public comments must be addressed

 Good to have started assertion and/or test writing, but not required

Candidate Recommendation

- Document is stable and ready for implementation
- This document must also reference a test suite (usually with assertions) and includes call for implementations
 - Test suite goal is to test spec, not implementations (not a conformance suite)
- Must specify how many implementations are required
- Other group chairs notified
- Must specify sufficient review period to get implementations
- Must address all public comments
- Changes beyond clarifications force you back to WD

Proposed Recommendation

- Document is stable and implementable "Basically done"
- Announced to other group chairs
- Minimum 4 week review
- Must address all public comments
- No changes allowed

Recommendation

• It's done!

• Announcements go out to Chairs and on W3C website

Addressing public comments

- What does it mean?
- Resolution must be documented
- Original commenter must ACCEPT THE RESOLUTION
- Reasonable time limits are allowed to deal with absent commenters

Status of WebRTC API draft

- First Public Working Draft
- Will now begin issuing Working Drafts every few weeks
