Text Alternatives	<p>About the Rating: For 'Level 0', the image type can be for 'meaningful images'</p> <p>Level 0: Less than 60% of all images have appropriate text alternatives OR there is a critical error in the process</p>	<p>Level 0: Less than 60% of all meaningful/contextual images have appropriate text alternatives OR there is a critical error in the process</p>
3.2 Clear words	<p>About the guideline: This guideline is vague to understand its purpose</p>	<p>About the guideline: The guideline can be rephrased to e.g. "Use common clear words, and avoid technical language that may not be familiar to all types of users"</p>
3.2 Clear words	<p>Example provided: In the example of Clear words how-to provided, it looks like most of the information are cut-short to satisfy this guideline which is not appropriate</p> <p>Example of Clear Words:</p> <p>Before: The Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommends a half hour or more of moderate physical activity on most days, preferably every day. The activity can include brisk walking, calisthenics, home care, gardening, moderate sports exercise, and dancing.</p> <p>After: Do at least 30 minutes of exercise, like brisk walking, most days of the week</p>	<p>Example: The same example in example of Clear words how-to rephrased below with most of the information in the 'After' sentence as well.</p> <p>Example of Clear Words:</p> <p>Before: The Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommends a half hour or more of moderate physical activity on most days, preferably every day. The activity can include brisk walking, calisthenics*, home care, gardening, moderate sports exercise, and dancing.</p> <p>After: Do at least 30 minutes of moderate physical exercises like brisk walking, home care, gardening, dancing, jogging on most days of the week</p> <p>*The word 'Calisthenics is not a common word' which can be avoided</p>

<p>Captions</p>	<p>Rating: I agree the informational / essential videos to be categorized in the rating to avoid more failures in testing approach</p>	<p>Rating: The Rating to categorize the videos as e.g. Rating 0: No meta data on Informational / essential videos</p>
<p>Captions</p>	<p>Question on 'Closed Caption' or 'Open Caption'</p>	<p>Opinion: I would give one more thumbs-up to 'Closed Caption' when compared to 'Open Caption'.</p> <p>The reason is 'closed caption gives more control to the user when to turn on or off. Also, the Closed Caption can be customizable (like font face, size, position) by the editor'</p> <p>I would suggest the Rating can determine based on the presence and accuracy of the Closed Caption</p>
