Hi.

Thanks for your quick reply.

Exchanging XML and/or MIDI files via a Cloud service is of course an option, but I wondered if there is a more sophisticated way the cooperate with each other. Do you think it is possible (or have experience with) the following options:

- 1) Implementing MusicXML in an XML database (like BaseX) and writing the contents of an XML file directly in this database
- 2) Storing the MusicXML formatted XML files from f.e. Finale, Sibelius, etc. in a relational database (as string?) together with some metadata like, language, author, version date, etc. etc.

In other words, I'm looking for a "digital music sheet database system" with a web based front end. So composers can upload their music in a user-friendly way, and musicians can view the music online via their browser.

Thanks for contacting MakeMusic Customer Success.

We do not currently have a cloud service associated with our company; however, you should be able to export MusicXML and/or save MIDI files from Finale and export/save them to your preferred cloud service (Google Drive, Dropbox, etc.). This will allow your musicians/composers to access these files from the cloud service you have created. I'm new to MakeMusic and your products and the global MusicXML structure as being a music sheet interchange format.

Just image a community of both composers and musicians. The composers who compose and write music want to store this in a central place, for example in a database (in the cloud) based on MusicXML.

Other composers must then be able to read and correct the music.

Musicians from the same community must then be able to read the music on whatever device (PC. Mac, tablet) or be able to print it as a PDF file.

Additional functionality like adding MIDI files is also wanted.

Does such an architecture exist or is it possible to create this environment with your products?
